HYDERABAD: A BRIGHT FUTURE ROOTED IN A NOBLE PAST

Hyderabad is the State capital of Telangana in southern India. One of the leading centers for the technological industry, it also houses several restaurants, hotels and exclusive shops at international level.

The Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA) has one passenger terminal, a cargo terminal and two runways. There are also aviation training facilities, a fuel farm, a solar power plant and two maintenance-repair-operations (MRO) facilities. As of 2019 March, RGIA is the sixth busiest airport by passenger traffic in India. The airport served about 21.4 million passengers in fiscal year 2018–19, and it serves as a hub for Air India Regional, Blue Dart Aviation, SpiceJet, Lufthansa Cargo, Quikjet Cargo, and TrueJet, and as a focus city for IndiGo and Air India. The airport has connections with main world capitals.



The Hyderabad Metro is a rapid transit system, serving the city of Hyderabad. It is the second longest operational metro network in India after the Delhi Metro with 50 stations and the lines are arranged in a secant model.



The Charminar ("Four Minarets"), constructed in 1591, is a monument and mosque located in Hyderabad, Telangana, India. The landmark has become known globally as a symbol of Hyderabad and is listed among the most recognized structures in India. The Charminar's long history includes the existence of a mosque on its top floor for more than 400 years. While both historically and religiously significant, it is also known for the popular and busy local markets surrounding the structure, and has become one of the most frequented tourist attractions in Hyderabad.



The Buddha Statue of Hyderabad is a monolith located in India. It is the world's tallest monolith of Gautama Buddha, erected on Gibraltar Rock in the middle of Hussain Sagar lake.
